
With Japan, our ties go back far in history to the times when Buddhist monks used to travel to Japan from parts of South Asia that now form part of Pakistan.

The Founder of Pakistan Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah


eases donated testing kits to the National Institute of Health of Pakistan.

Due to the Pakistani government's "smart lockdown" strategy and with the help of friends such as Japan, the number of new coronavirus cases has gone down remarkably in the last two to three weeks.

Through this and other forthcoming projects, Japan will be benefiting from the large number of IT-focused, young and skilled individuals from Pakistan that will contribute to overcoming the workforce shortage in its critical IT industry.

On Pakistan's part, such projects will help in developing our technology and human resource base.

We hope that we will continue to see more substantial progress in the overall investment and trade relations between the two countries in the months and years to come.

Building upon last year's conclusion of




