At the regional level, Qatar has succeeded in hosting fruitful rounds of dialogue rounds between the United States and the Afghan Taliban movement, which led to the signing of a historic agreement between the two sides in Doha in February. In September, intra-Afghan negotiations between the government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan and the Taliban Movement, started in Doha, with the aim of achieving comprehensive and

lasting peace in Afghanistan.

Qatar attaches great importance to its distinguished relations with Japan, as one of our largest partners in the field of LNG, and the biggest trading partner. There is strong desire and political will at the leadership level in the two countries to enhance these relations and bring them to advanced stages of a long-term strategic partnership. It has established term contracts to supply LNG with many of the key Japanese buyers including JERA Co., Tohoku Electric Power Co., Kansai Electric Power Co., Chugoku Electric Power Co., Tokyo Gas Co., Osaka Gas Co., Toho Gas Co. and Shizuoka Gas Co.

Apart from these term contracts, Qatargas also delivers a significant amount of Japan's spot LNG requirements. Today, our commitment to serving the energy needs of our valued customers has never been stronger. As the world's premier LNG company, our customers know that they can rely on Qatargas to deliver safe and reliable LNG.

Qatargas, established in 1984, pioneered the LNG industry in Qatar and today is the largest producer of LNG in the world with an annual production capacity of 77 mtpa from its world-class facilities in Ras Laffan Industrial City, Qatar. The state of Qatar has announced plans to raise the country's LNG production capacity to 126 mtpa by 2027, representing an increase of 64% from the current volume.
