## Bilateral, regional work covers wide range of areas

This year's remembrance of the Proclamation of Philippine Independence is of exceptional significance. As we do every year, we recognize that we stand free and empowered

as a result of the sacrifice of heroes who came before us. But in the epic fight of 2020 against a pandemic that brought both the mighty and the humble down, those who stood between us and COVID-19 are our present-day heroes, ushering in the beginnings of hope in 2021.

The pandemic will always be the story

of how our front-line workers showed true heroism, as they battled with energy, commitment and care to lead us out of this darkness. Braving contagion themselves, they struggled against weariness and drew upon an ancient oath to care for anyone who needed help, and stood beside those we love when no one could stand beside them. In many instances, they fell together. To all doctors, nurses and caregivers, as well as the researchers and scientists around the world, please accept the tribute of a grateful world.

We extend our warmest greetings to our Japanese friends and kababayans in Japan, who deserve our deepest admiration for the forbearance they have collectively shown in the face of unimaginable challenges and sometimes grief. We send them our prayers for hope and healing.

To the government of Japan, may I say

that its continued care and support for the close to 300,000 Filipinos currently living and working in Japan have been a beacon of hope for the nation and for their grateful families back home. A testament to our successful work together to protect Filipinos overseas is the successful repatriation of more than 400 Filipino crew members and passengers last year from the quarantined cruise ship Diamond Princess.

The Philippines' bilateral relationship with Japan is one of its most consequential. It is the single biggest source of development funds to the Philippines, which is proof of Japan's pre-eminent role in our government's push for infrastructure development in the country. And through its bilateral and multilateral contributions, Japan enhances the Philippines' COVID-19 response measures, including for testing, quarantine facility expansion,

cold chain provisions and vaccines.

In this regard, our bilateral and regional work spans almost all sectors of the economy. human resource development. politics and defense, maritime domain awareness, science and technology cooperation, and the Mindanao peace process. The constraints imposed by the pandemic have not hampered high-level engagements, and through our shared recovery and revival, we will continue to deepen this partnership for the ultimate benefit of our two peoples and the wider region.

Though the shock of the coronavirus was brutal, some studies say that the pandemic will not deeply impair our ability to grow. Opportunities for expanding the Philippine economy, on the back of a very young population and the inherent strengths of a well-endowed country, remain. The conclusion of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership, which creates a huge regional market, and our connections through free trade agreements with many partners, provide pathways to growth, both for the Philippines and its partners.

2021 is a milestone year as the Philippines and Japan commemorate the 65th anniversary of the normalization of diplomatic relations, embodying the continuity of a long relationship, and the 10th year of
