Today, Hungarians all over the world commemorate the beginning of the 1956 revolution. Distinguished readers may remember that 65 years ago the people of Hungary rose up against the oppres-

Hungary is a Central European country, living astride important crossroads, and Hungarians know that isolating and locking up have never offered long-term benefits in any situation. That is why Hungary was among the first EU nations to introduce mass vaccinations, inoculating a large share of its population by spring 2021.

Actually, the fact that the world now has a safe and effective vaccine against COVID-19 can largely be attributed to a Hungarian scientist, Katalin Kariko, the "mother" of the messenger RNA vaccine, who received many awards for her discovery, including this year's Keio Medical Science Prize.

Largely thanks to the new vaccines, we have been able to keep Hungary a safe and free place where people can openly socialize, travel and engage in daily productive activities. We are very proud that our efforts against the pandemic have been acknowledged in Japan, as Hungary's name consistently appears among the top countries in the Nikkei COVID-19 Recovery Index.

Keeping our open economy running continues to be of the utmost importance for us. Hosting more than 180 Japanese companies, Hungary has always remained open for business and business-related travel from Japan. Fortunately, the pandemic has in no way affected our strong bilateral political relations, either. Hungary's Peter Szijjarto was the first foreign minister to visit Tokyo this year,
